In figure 12 the graphs representing the monthly production of fruit of the Green and Tree-Ripe grades are arranged by strains from left to right, according to their rank for average total production as shown by Table XI. To bring out more closely the variations in production each month between the trees of the different strains the data were rearranged as shown in figure 13. Each graph represents the proportions of fruit produced during a month by the trees of the various strains, which are presented in each month in the same order from left to right as in figure 12. The low production in January of fruits of both the Green and TreeRipe grades by the trees of all the strains is quite marked, and it is probable that if all conditions had been normal the records would indicate a gradual upward curve at that time instead of the break that is shown. Table IX shows that in 1914 and 1916 the time between the November and December pickings was longer than usual, which would tend to increase the yield recorded for December. In those same two seasons the time between the December and January pickings was less than the normal period, resulting in a small recorded crop in January. Table XIV shows that a 2 --inch ring was used in picking the fruit in December, 1914, and for several months previous, but in...
