President (10,287 feet) which, with its twin peak Vice President (10,049 feet) connected by a fine snow saddle, was easily reached from the camp over an interesting ice and rock climb in four to five hours. Mt. Kerr (9,384 feet) and Kiwetinok Peak (9,512 feet) at the head of the valley were easy climbs. On the former we found the record of Edward Whymper s ascent when he visited this region in 1901. Mt. Marpole (9,822 feet) separated from the President by Emerald Pass, a sheer rock peak, was the sporting climb of the region and was ascended several times under the leadership of the Swiss guides. Mt. Habel (10,361 feet) lying some distance north of Camp and reached over...
