Brand New Book ***** Print on Demand *****.In his January 29, 2002 State of the Union message, President Bush characterized Iraq as part of an axis of evil, along with Iran and North Korea. The President identified the key threat from Iraq as its development of weapons of mass destruction (WMD), and the potential for Iraq to transfer WMD to the terrorist groups it sponsors. In recent statements, the President and other senior officials have said the United States will ensure that Saddam Hussein is not positioned to pose a major and imminent threat to U.S. national security. The President's subsequent statements have left observers with the clear implication that, unless Iraq allows full and unfettered access to all sites by U.N. weapons inspectors, the United States will take military action to achieve the ouster of Iraq's President Saddam Hussein and his Ba'ath Party regime. Regime change has been official U.S. policy since October 1998. Even before that, U.S. efforts to oust Saddam have been pursued, with varying degrees of intensity, since the end of the Gulf war in 1991. These efforts...
